I am pleased to assist you with your Freedom of Information Act request for information ("FOIA Request"), received by the Village of Bensenville on September 23, 2016. You requested copies of the records indicated below:


*"all phone records, text's, emails and any and all electronics owned or issued by the village of Bensenville, from Trustee Henry Wesseler for the dates of August 6, 2016 through August 13, 2016. These are all sent and received messages of all of the above devices."*

Enclosed is all the information pertaining to the transaction of public business that is responsive to your FOIA Request, except as otherwise indicated herein. The Village has withheld certain e-mail communications between the Village staff, Trustee Henry Wesseler and the Village Attorney pursuant to section 7(1)(m) of FOIA which provides that privileged attorney-client communication is exempt from public disclosure. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(m). The Village has also withheld an internal memo pursuant to section 7(1)(f) because this record involves the formulation of action, policy and opinions and is exempt from public disclosure. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(f). The Village has also redacted information in connection with ongoing criminal investigations pursuant to section 7(1)(d)(i), which is not subject to public disclosure. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(d)(i). The Village has also redacted information pertaining to a minor who has been arrested before his or her 18th birthday pursuant to section 7(1)(a) of FOIA and section 1-7 of the Juvenile Court Act of 1987, which information is exempt from disclosure. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(a); 705 ILCS 405/1-7. The Village has also redacted the personal telephone numbers because this is private information pursuant to sections 2(c-5) and 7(1)(b) of FOIA. 5 ILCS 140/2(c-5); 7(1)(b).

Should you believe that this Response constitutes an improper denial of your request, you may appeal such by filing a request for review within sixty (60) days of the date of this letter with the Public Access Counselor of the Illinois Attorney General's Office, Public Access Bureau, 500 South Second Street, Springfield, Illinois 62706; telephone 1-887-299-FOIA; e-mail: [publicaccess@atg.state.il.us](mailto:publicaccess@atg.state.il.us). You may also have a right of judicial review of the denial under Section 11 of FOIA, 5 ILCS 140/11.

Alderman Napolitano (41st Ward) has set up a separate e-mail address, [Chicagoplanenoise@gmail.com](mailto:Chicagoplanenoise@gmail.com), to receive narrative descriptions of the effects of airplane noise on Chicago area residents. He is asking anyone who is adversely affected by airplane noise (not just 41st Ward residents) to please write a short description - a paragraph or two or three (no more than a page) - describing how airplane noise impacts their lives and their neighborhoods and send it to the above address. In addition, he asks everyone who sends an e-mail to put in the "Subject:" line: "TO: Catherine Dunlap, re Airplane Noise". In addition to her role as the mayor's 41st Ward designee to the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission (ONCC), and the ward's only voting member on the ONCC, Catherine Dunlap is also the Chairperson of the ONCC's Technical Committee, whose decisions affect all ONCC members, and she also sits on the Residential Sound Insulation Committee of the ONCC which makes decisions regarding the sound insulation of homes. Alderman Napolitano will see to it that all e-mails that are sent to the [chicagoplanenoise](mailto:chicagoplanenoise) address are delivered to Catherine Dunlap, probably in person. Please pass this information on to others who are impacted by airplane noise and who may not be on this e-mail list.


Hello,

**Summary:**

The average time in Fly Quiet was 6 hours and 27 minutes per night.  
 The percentage of operations on the rotation runways in the primary or secondary configuration was 76%.  
 At the time of the report, operations data was not yet available for the nights on 7/28, 7/29 and 7/30. Results will be posted when data is available.

**Comments:**

- a: There were 11 requests granted for alternative runways during the rotation period.
- b: On the night of 7/24, the start of Fly Quiet was delayed and duration of the Rotation Test was limited due to weather conditions in Chicago.
- c: Winds were less than 5 knots 43% of the time (potential for east or west flow).
- d: Winds were greater than 5 knots and from the west 19% of the time (potential for west flow).
- e: Winds were greater than 5 knots and from the east 12% of the time (potential for east flow).
- f: Winds were greater than 5 knots and from the south 0% of the time.
- g: Winds were greater than 5 knots and from the north 16% of the time.
- h: Winds were greater than 5 knots and variable 10% of the time.

**Background:**

On June 17, 1997, the City of Chicago announced that airlines operating at O'Hare International Airport had agreed to use designated noise abatement flight procedures in accordance with the Fly Quiet Program. This program was implemented in an effort to reduce the impacts of aircraft noise on neighborhoods surrounding O'Hare.

The Fly Quiet Program is a voluntary program that encourages pilots and air traffic controllers to use designated nighttime preferential runways and flight tracks developed by the Chicago Department of Aviation (CDA) in cooperation with the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission (ONCC), the airlines and the air traffic controllers. These preferred routes are intended to direct aircraft over less-populated areas, such as forest preserves and highways, as well as commercial and industrial areas.

The Chicago Department of Aviation (CDA) has submitted a Fly Quiet Runway Rotation Test (Test) to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for approval of a six-month test period. The purpose of the test is to evaluate a condition that could be in place until Runway 14R/32L is permanently closed. The Test is intended to occur during the overnight hours when demand requires one arrival and one departure runway. The Test includes a 25-week schedule that consists of 12 weekly periods intended to balance the overnight noise. Each new week will begin on Sunday evening at 10 p.m. or after when demand allows for one arrival and one departure runway.




## FLY QUIET II RUNWAY ROTATION TEST (Week 6)

This chart illustrates the proposed runway use configurations for the Fly Quiet II Runway Rotation Plan (out of a 12 week rotation schedule). For each week, a primary and secondary runway use configuration is provided to accommodate potential changes in wind direction. Historical wind data suggests that the primary runway use configuration can be used the majority of the time. The runway use configurations have been defined to balance noise exposure by community by complying with the criteria approved by the ONCC Fly Quiet Committee. The use of east flow, west flow, parallel, and diagonal runways is rotated on a weekly basis. Special procedures have been defined to accommodate additional aircraft that require added runway length.



### Notes


- 2016 Runway Rotation Test
- Use of these runways is voluntary, pilots are encouraged to use designated nighttime preferential runways.
- Runway 10L/28R, if closed for noise abatement, would be made available for flights that require additional runway length after operator coordination, at a minimum of 2 hours prior to arrival or departure, with Chicago Department of Aviation (CDA) Operations.
- Alternative runways may be used to allow for construction, snow removal, runway maintenance, runway inspection and specific aircraft operational needs. Available runways are determined by Chicago Department of Aviation (CDA) Operations, and prevailing winds. When Runway 10L/28R is closed for construction, Runway 10C/28C will be made available for flights that require additional runway length.

## **FAiR Responds to Groundbreaking for 6th runway: The mayor has been sold an "Airfield of Dreams."**

The FAiR (Fair Allocation in Runways) Coalition feels that the city is acting irresponsibly by removing options for noise mitigation before a testing period on runway rotation has even been completed. Without revision to the current runway construction, the remaining diagonal 14R/32L, which is instrumental to the overnight runway rotation, will be lost in 2018 or 2019 in addition to the other diagonal runway. Therefore this groundbreaking sets into motion the end of the current fly quiet rotation, taking away the only relief in the last three years that provides the hardest hit residents with a night's sleep.

Mayor Emanuel has unfortunately been sold an "Airfield of Dreams". The city has already built three new runways, but no one is coming. In fact, the projections for the current year would result in the fourth consecutive year of declining operations. O'Hare now ranks 25th out of the 30 core US airports in projected annual operations growth. The demand for which the completion of this final runway and OMP are designed won't materialize for almost another 25 years according to current FAA projections. How do you explain to residents that they need to suffer now for demand decades away?

The residents are now left to shoulder the burden of the city's failure to address the noise impacts of OMP through the use of these existing runways. The city had a choice meet the needs of O'Hare **and** provide noise relief, or move forward with a plan that abandons the residents by building unneeded capacity. The Mayor's choice is clear; the quality of life of his constituents and the suburban communities are of no value. That will be his legacy.

# CHEMICALLY CONTAMINATED DRINKING WATER IN THE U.S.

4-Hour Online Course - Sept. 20-21, 2016

Contaminated drinking water has been in the news nationally in recent months. In this 4-hour online course, attendees will learn basic information about public (and private) water supplies and treatment processes; a brief history of contamination of drinking water supplies; key characteristics of lead and other heavy metals; and current observations about risk perception and litigation related to contaminated drinking water.

The course will be presented in two 2-hour sessions held on consecutive days, Sept. 20 and 21, 2016. Both classes will start promptly at 10 a.m. Pacific, 11 a.m. Mountain, noon Central and 1 p.m. Eastern. The sessions will be recorded and attendees may attend live or via on-demand streaming video.

Examples of lead and PFOS/PFOA will be used throughout the course to illustrate key concepts. In addition, flash polls will be used throughout the webinar sessions to elicit your input and experience.

Attendees will be provided a detailed agenda and a copy of the presentation slides.

## INSTRUCTOR

Jennifer S. Heath, PH.D., has 30 years of experience in the fields of chemical product safety and environmental contamination. Drinking water contamination has been a theme of her work throughout her career, from her early work on a contamination topic (public drinking water supply wells contaminated with chlorinated solvents) to her early work with a state health department (primarily lead, chlorinated solvents and petroleum products in drinking water) and throughout her long consulting career (e.g., assessing risks associated with domestic use of contaminated groundwater) and continuing on to her work as an expert witness in litigation.

Jennifer's education provides a broad perspective on public health issues in general and drinking water specifically. She holds a nursing degree (she is a registered nurse in Colorado and New York) to her M.S. in Nutrition and Toxicology (North Carolina State University), from her B.S. in Public Health (University of Massachusetts at Amherst) to her M.P.A. in Public Policy Studies (Duke University), and on to her Ph.D. in Environmental Toxicology (Cornell University).





## A&B Irrigation Project




After the much-anticipated announcement of the manufacture of the world's first 54 and 60-inch solid wall PVC pipe, we can now say the first big project installation is complete.

The project entitled "A&B Irrigation" includes 15,642 feet of 48" and 54" as well as 22,894 feet of 30", 36" and 42"

PVC pipe. The remaining 55,980 feet is made up of 10" through 27". The pressure rating of the pipes ranges from DR51 (80 psi) to DR32.5 (125 psi). The A & B Irrigation District was established in 1966 in Rupert, Idaho and delivers water to 82,600 irrigated acres of sugar beets, barley, alfalfa and potatoes in Southern Idaho. It is served by two major water

sources: surface water from the Snake River and groundwater from the Eastern Snake Plain aquifer. It is unique to Idaho in that all of the water it delivers is pumped.

The total length of the pipeline, including all sub-feeder lines off the mainline is approximately 19 miles. It extends 8 miles north of the newly constructed Snake River pump station. The pipeline begins with 54 inch DR 32.5 at the pump station and progressively reduces to 10 inch. This project allowed the district to abandon 8 miles of earthen canals, which saves approximately 1200 acre-feet of water and \$40,000.00 dollars in operations and management costs annually.



The pipeline installation had to be completed on a very short timeframe from the end of November 2015 through the end of March in an attempt to deliver water for spring 2016 planting. Diamond Plastics delivered all 94,516 feet of this pipe within 2 months. Knife River was the winning bidder on the construction contract. They started the project with four to five crews working 6 and 7 days a week in temperatures as low as minus five degrees Fahrenheit.

All parties were pleased with every phase of the project, as there were no major setbacks. Mike Cole with Knife River stated, "Knife River is in part a natural resource company, and being so we are interested in products that are truly sustainable. Our experience with PVC pipe is just that, truly sustainable. PVC is not a pipe that we are routinely contracted to rehab or replace, in fact PVC is often used to replace other pipe materials."



ORDINANCE # 47-2015

**AN ORDINANCE GRANTING APPROVAL OF A PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT TO  
TO CONSTRUCT FIVE TOWNHOMES FOR THE PROPERTY COMMONLY  
IDENTIFIED AS 201 SOUTH YORK ROAD, BENSENVILLE, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS**, Isa Becovic ("Owner/Applicant"), filed an application (CDC Case #2015 – 13) for a Planned Unit Development to allow for the construction of Five Townhomes with a code deviation to reduce the front yard setback from 30 to 15 feet, Municipal Code Sections 10 – 5G – 3, 10 – 5G - 4 and 10 – 10 of the Village of Bensenville Zoning Ordinance ("Zoning Ordinance") for the property located at 201 South York Road, Bensenville, as legally described in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Subject Property"), a copy of said application being contained on file in the Community and Economic Development Department; and

**WHEREAS**, Notice of Public Hearing with respect to the Planned Unit Development and code deviation sought by the Applicant was published in the Bensenville Independent on May 14, 2015 by the Village of Bensenville, and notice was also given via posting of a Public Hearing Sign on the Subject Property and via First Class mail to taxpayers of record within 250 feet of the Subject Property, all as required by the statutes of the State of Illinois and the ordinances of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to said Notice, the Community Development Commission of the Village of Bensenville conducted a Public Hearing on June 1, 2015 as required by the statutes of the State of Illinois and the ordinances of the Village; and

**WHEREAS**, after hearing the application, the Community Development Commission approved the findings of fact submitted by Village Staff recommending approval of the Planned Unit Development with code deviation and, thereafter, voted unanimously (7-0) to recommend approval of the request for the Planned Unit Development, and forwarded its recommendations, including the Staff Report and findings to the Community and Economic Development Committee, which concurred in the recommendation made therein, as are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "B"; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 18, 2015 the Community and Economic Development Committee then forwarded its recommendation, along with that of the Community Development Commission, to the President and Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Village Trustees have reviewed the matter herein and have determined that approval of the requested Planned Unit Development as recommended by the Community Development Commission is consistent with the Zoning Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville, Counties of DuPage and Cook, Illinois, duly assembled at a regular meeting, as follows:

**SECTION ONE:** That the forgoing recitals are hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein.

**SECTION TWO:** That the Subject Property is currently zoned under the Zoning Ordinance as RA-1 Mixed Single Family, which zoning classification shall remain in effect subject to the Planned Unit Development granted herein.

**SECTION THREE:** That the Staff Report and Recommendation to approve the Planned Unit Development sought, as allowed by the Zoning Ordinance, Sections 10-5G – 3, 10 – 5G - 4 and 10 – 10, as adopted by the Community Development Commission as shown in Exhibit “B” is hereby adopted by the President and Board of Trustees, the Board of Trustees finding that said Planned Unit Development are proper and necessary.

**SECTION FOUR:** That the Planned Unit Development to construct Five Townhomes with the code deviation sought by the Applicant of the Subject Property is hereby granted subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The Planned Unit Development be granted solely to Isa Becovic and shall be transferred only after a review by the Community Development Commission (CDC) and approval of the Village Board. In the event of change in tenancy of this property, the proprietors shall appear before a public meeting of the CDC. The CDC shall review the request and in its sole discretion, shall either; recommend that the Village Board approve of the transfer of the lease and / or ownership to the new proprietor without amendment to the Conditional Use Permit, or if the CDC deems that the new proprietor contemplates a change in use which is inconsistent with the Conditional Use Permit, the new proprietor shall be required to petition for a new public hearing before the CDC for a new Conditional Use Permit.

- (2) The property be developed in substantial compliance with the plans prepared by Koziol Engineering Services dated 05.04.15 and W. Lloyd Christoph & Associates dated 08.25.15, received 09.03.15, attached as Exhibit "C" and the Landscape Plan submitted as part of the application. All subject to final municipal staff review and permit approvals.
- (3) The building's architecture shall be revised to include
  - a. A "stagger" of the homes along York Road.
  - b. Full height masonry on the front façade of some of the homes
- (4) Elimination of the project identification signage at Wood Street & York Road.
- (5) Staff final review and approval of the landscape plan, building materials and their colors.
- (6) Appropriate CCRs and HOA documents shall be submitted, reviewed and approved by the Village Staff.
- (7) Staff shall review and approve plans concerning the location and procedures for trash and refuse as well as a snow removal plan.
- (8) Based on recent modifications of the site plan, the applicant shall review engineering plans for possible expansion of rain gardens, size of storm water pipe or other similar modifications to improve stormwater management.
- (9) The operations of the subject property, including snow removal, parking, trash/refuse removal and any others as deemed appropriate, shall be reviewed for functionality and external impacts twelve months after occupancy is granted.

**SECTION FIVE:** That all requirements of the Zoning Ordinance shall be applicable except as amended by the Planned Unit Development granted herein.

**SECTION SIX:** That all other ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, are, to the extent of such conflict, expressly repealed.

**SECTION SEVEN:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

**Findings of Fact**

Motion: Commissioner Pisano made a motion to approve the findings of facts for the requested PUD consisting of:

1. **Superior Design:** The PUD represents a more creative approach to the unified planning of development and incorporates a higher standard of integrated design and amenity than could be achieved under otherwise applicable regulations, and solely on this basis modifications to such regulations are warranted. *Superior design is reflected throughout the PUD. The reduced front yard setback allows the flexibility to create the gateway envisioned in various municipal plans. The design of the five townhomes displays creativity in its creation of private useable outdoor space while providing for the necessary parking of vehicles.*
2. **Meet PUD Requirements:** The PUD meets the requirements for planned unit developments set forth in this Title, and no modifications to the use and design standards otherwise applicable are allowed other than those permitted herein. *The PUD meets the intent of the Zoning Ordinance. The front yard setback is the sole deviation.*
3. **Consistent With Village Plan:** The PUD is generally consistent with the objectives of the Village general development plan as viewed in light of any changed conditions since its adoption. *The PUD is an example of the execution of the Village Plan. The PUD location has long been envisioned for this type of residential development. The proposal is in compliance with the Village's Comprehensive Plan and creates additional residents in or near the downtown area.*
4. **Public Welfare:** The PUD will not be detrimental to the public health, safety or general welfare. *The PUD will not be detrimental to public health, safety or general welfare in any way.*
5. **Compatible With Environs:** Neither the PUD nor any portion thereof will be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other properties in its vicinity, seriously impair property values or environmental quality in the neighborhood, nor impede the orderly development of surrounding property. *The PUD will not be injurious to properties in its vicinity*

*and will likely increase property values as a result of its superior design and the continued revitalizing the York Road corridor.*

6. **Natural Features:** The design of the PUD is as consistent as practical with preservation of any natural features such as flood plains, wooded areas, natural drainageways or other areas of sensitive or valuable environmental character. *The PUD is consistent as practical with preservation of any natural features and is designed to reflect these needs as evidenced by engineering plans.*
7. **Circulation:** Streets, sidewalks, pedestrianways, bicycle paths and off-street parking and loading are provided as appropriate to planned land uses. They are adequate in location, size, capacity and design to ensure safe and efficient circulation of automobiles, trucks, bicycles, pedestrians, fire trucks, garbage trucks and snow plows, as appropriate, without blocking traffic, creating unnecessary pedestrian-vehicular conflict, creating unnecessary through traffic within the PUD or unduly interfering with the safety or capacity of adjacent streets. *An efficient and effective circulation design serves as an asset to the PUD; its superior design is reflected by the shared access driveway for all garages thereby reducing the amount of impervious area and providing safer alley access.*
8. **Open Spaces And Landscaping:** The quality and quantity of common open spaces or landscaping provided are consistent with the higher standards of design and amenity required of a PUD. *As with the architectural design, and circulation plans, landscaping will be utilized to distinguish the PUD. The landscape design reflects significant utilization of plants, trees, and shrubbery throughout the property as a key distinguishing element.*
9. **Covenants:** Adequate provision has been made in the form of deed restrictions, homeowners or condominium associations or the like for:
  - a. The presentation and regular maintenance of any open spaces, thoroughfares, utilities, water retention or detention areas and other common elements not to be dedicated to the Village or to another public body.
  - b. Such control of the use and exterior design of individual structures, if any, as is necessary for continuing conformance to the PUD plan, such provision to be binding on all future ownerships. *Appropriate Codes, Covenants & Restrictions (CCRs) shall be submitted, reviewed and approved by the Municipal staff and Village Attorneys. Similarly Home Owners' Association By – Laws shall be reviewed and approved by the Village.*

**10. Public Services:** The land uses, intensities and phasing of the PUD are consistent with the anticipated ability of the Village, the school system and other public bodies to provide and economically support police and fire protection, water supply, sewage disposal, schools and other public facilities and services without placing undue burden on existing residents and businesses. *The PUD is consistent with the anticipated ability of the Village, School system and other public bodies.*

**11. Phasing:** Each development phase of the PUD can, together with any phases that preceded it, exist as an independent unit that meets all of the foregoing criteria and all other applicable regulations herein even if no subsequent phase should ever be completed. *The PUD phasing is consistent with requirements and foregoing criteria.*







This new runway is about .5 of a mile directly parallel of 27L/9R, an existing runway already in constant use (same area of the city). So, this means more flights overhead.

The new runway adds "the equivalent of the capacity of a third airport," or "another Midway," to O'Hare.

## **FAiR Responds to Groundbreaking for 6th runway: The mayor has been sold an "Airfield of Dreams."**

The FAiR (Fair Allocation in Runways) Coalition feels that the city is acting irresponsibly by removing options for noise mitigation before a testing period on runway rotation has even been completed. Without revision to the current runway construction, the remaining diagonal 14R/32L, which is instrumental to the overnight runway rotation, will be lost in 2018 or 2019 in addition to the other diagonal runway. Therefore this groundbreaking sets into motion the end of the current fly quiet rotation, taking away the only relief in the last three years that provides the hardest hit residents with a night's sleep.

Mayor Emanuel has unfortunately been sold an "Airfield of Dreams". The city has already built three new runways, but no one is coming. In fact, the projections for the current year would result in the fourth consecutive year of declining operations. O'Hare now ranks 25th out of the 30 core US airports in projected annual operations growth. The demand for which the completion of this final runway and OMP are designed won't materialize for almost another 25 years according to current FAA projections. How do you explain to residents that they need to suffer now for demand decades away?

The residents are now left to shoulder the burden of the city's failure to address the noise impacts of OMP through the use of these existing runways. The city had a choice meet the needs of O'Hare **and** provide noise relief, or move forward with a plan that abandons the residents by building unneeded capacity. The Mayor's choice is clear; the quality of life of his constituents and the suburban communities are of no value. That will be his legacy.
