## **BENSENVILLE SOCCER LEAGUE REPORT FOR 2014**

### **Purpose of this report (Prepared for Stakeholders of the Program):**

This report was created to highlight the positive influence of the summer soccer league in four apartment complexes in Bensenville. The Bensenville Soccer League has been running for a number of years with the partnership of District 100's Board of Directors with President Mary Ribando, and Fenton High School leadership including, Superintendent Kathie Pierce, Principal Todd Leden, and Athletic Director Todd Becker.

On the summer of 2014, approximately 400 children and 250 adults played soccer on the Fenton fields. Most of the participants were enrolled from Bensenville and the adult players were almost 100% from the four apartment buildings (see below).

Since there we have a **"no drop off policy,"** the parents or parent in most cases spend Saturday and Sunday involved in soccer.

### **The target apartment complexes for this program:**

- Elm Court Apartments (Behind the Chase Bank on Grand Ave)
- Fairway Green Apartments (George and York by the White Pines Golf Course)
- Regents Park Apartments (Irving Park Rd east of the Dunkin Donuts)
- West View II Apartments (Behind the Dunkin Donuts and West to the Marshall)

Besides the significant crime reduction in these targeted buildings, there have been several collateral benefits including the health of the community in these apartments. In alignment with the **"B-Well Bensenville"** program/initiative, the adults and children from these communities have a more active lifestyle during the summer. The B-Well Bensenville is a program launched by the Bensenville Youth Coalition.

Some of the additional collateral benefits are as follows:

- Reduction in drinking of alcohol in public/common areas.
- Significant reduction in crimes related to "Disorderly Conduct," "Violence," and other related to actions by adults that can produce an arrest.
- Significant amount of community and social cohesion. Which the social and community clubs that have been formed with concerned parents to help keep crime low and better their communities.
- A literacy program that has been planned for the summer of 2015, since a few in the residents in these apartment buildings never went to school and are illiterate.
- A happy member of the community is a better worker. Employers in the temporary agencies have provided positive feedback that their workforce is doing much better with their health since soccer was implemented.
- They have successfully removed the gangs that had for decades control these buildings. *This is a direct results from the comprehensive community policing programs currently running in Bensenville and the soccer league.*

Thanks to the support from Fenton High School and District 100, the parents can bring their children to play soccer and they can actually be part of the coaching team, if they want to. *This is how traditionally is done in Mexico and other Latin American countries. We have kept this tradition.*

The volunteers that are not paid are around 50. The soccer league, which is running under "Liga de Futbol Latinos Unidos" for the last 3 years, have made the programs affordable for low income families in Bensenville and in particular families who reside in these 4 apartment complexes.

While the focus was in these apartment buildings, players are now coming from all over Bensenville. Even students who play soccer for Fenton High School are also taking part in the summer soccer league. Also the league has now become diverse, since registration is open to the entire community (flyers are sent in English and Spanish).

Traditional Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) guidelines track eight "Index Crimes," known also as Part 1 crimes. The UCR system includes crimes that are most likely to be reported to the police and to occur with sufficient frequency to provide an adequate basis for comparison. Part 1 crime definitions are listed below:

<b>Table 1-A: Part 1 Crimes against Persons (Violent Crime)</b>	
<b>CRIME</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Homicide</b>	<p>Homicide includes the offenses of Murder and No negligent Manslaughter and is the willful killing of one human being by another. As a general rule, any death due to injuries received in a fight, argument, quarrel, assault, or commission of a crime is counted as a Homicide. The definition of Homicide excludes the following situations: deaths caused by negligence, suicide, or accident; justifiable homicides; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are counted as Aggravated Assaults.</p> <p>It is important to note that Homicides are counted based on the specific circumstances of the incidents, not on the criminal charges filed as a result of those incidents. For instance, situations where a victim dies of a heart attack as the result of a robbery or witnessing a crime do not meet the criteria for inclusion in the Homicide classification.</p>
<b>Sexual Assault</b>	<p>Sex Assault includes only Forcible Rape, which is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults with attempt to commit rape, and other attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force, are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are excluded. Sexual attacks on males are counted as Aggravated Assaults or other sex offenses, depending on the circumstances and the extent of any injuries.</p>
<b>Robbery</b>	<p>Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.</p>
<b>Aggravated Assault</b>	<p>Aggravated Assault is the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. Aggravated Assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by other means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. An attempted Aggravated Assault that involves the display of—or threat to use—a gun, knife, or other weapon is included in this crime category, because serious personal injury would likely result if the assault were completed.</p>

<b>Table 1-B: Part 1 Property Crimes</b>	
<b>CRIME</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Burglary</b>	Burglary is the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as a burglary.
<b>Larceny (and Theft from Motor Vehicle)</b>	Larceny is the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another; attempts to do these acts are included in the definition. This crime category includes shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse-snatching, bicycle thefts, and so forth, in which no use of force, violence, or fraud occurs. Excluded from Larceny are Auto Theft and crimes that involve Embezzlement, confidence games, Forgery, and worthless checks, which are classified in separate offense categories. Theft from Motor Vehicle is the theft of articles from a motor vehicle, whether locked or unlocked, or the theft of any part or accessory affixed to the interior or exterior of a motor vehicle in a manner that would make the item an attachment of the vehicle or necessary for its operation.
<b>Auto Theft</b>	Auto Theft is the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. The offense includes the stealing of automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, snowmobiles, etc. The taking of a motor vehicle for temporary use by persons having lawful access is excluded from this definition.
<b>Arson</b>	Arson is the willful or malicious burning or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

**Part 2 Crimes**

The Part 1 crimes represent approximately two-thirds of all crimes reported in Denver, although this portion varies over time. The definitions for the other crimes, called Part 2 crimes, are listed in the following tables.

<b>Table 2-A: Other Crimes against Persons</b>	
<b>CRIME</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Other Assault</b>	Other Assault includes assaults and attempted assaults which are not of an aggravated nature and do not result in serious injury to the victim.
<b>Sex Offenses</b>	Sex Offenses include statutory rape and offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like. Attempts are included. Excluded from this category are Sex Assault and Prostitution and Commercialized Vice.
<b>Offenses against the Family and Children</b>	Offenses Against the Family and Children are unlawful, nonviolent acts by a family member (or legal guardian) that threaten the physical, mental, or economic well-being or morals of another family member and that are not classifiable as other offenses, such as Sex Assault, Other Assault or Sex Offenses. Attempts are included.

<b>Table 2-B: Public Disorder Crimes</b>	
<b>CRIME</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Criminal Mischief</b>	Vandalism involves acts that willfully or maliciously destroy, injure, disfigure, or deface any public or private property, real or personal, without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law. Attempts are included. Graffiti is a form of Vandalism.
<b>Prostitution and Commercialized Vice</b>	Prostitution and Commercialized Vice include the unlawful promotion of or participation in sexual activities for profit, including attempts.
<b>Drunkenness</b>	Drunkenness is to drink alcoholic beverages to the extent that one's mental faculties and physical coordination are substantially impaired. Excludes Driving Under the Influence.
<b>Disorderly Conduct</b>	Disorderly conduct is any behavior that tends to disturb the public peace or decorum, scandalize the community, or shock the public sense of morality.
<b>Vagrancy</b>	Vagrancy is the violation of a court order, regulation, ordinance, or law requiring the withdrawal of persons from the streets or other specified areas; prohibiting persons from remaining in an area or place in an idle or aimless manner; or prohibiting persons from going from place to place without visible means of support.
<b>Curfew and Loitering</b>	Curfew and Loitering offenses involve violations by juveniles of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

<b>Table 2-C: Drug and Alcohol Offenses</b>	
<b>CRIME</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Drug Abuse Violations</b>	Drug Abuse Violations include the production (cultivation and/or manufacture), transportation or importation, distribution or sale, purchase, possession, or use of any controlled drug or narcotic substance. The following drug categories are specified: opium or cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine); marijuana; synthetic narcotics – manufactured narcotics that can cause true addiction (Demerol, methadone); and dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, Benzedrine).
<b>Liquor Law Offenses</b>	Liquor Law Offenses include the unlawful manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages, not including Driving Under the Influence and Drunkenness. Federal violations are also excluded.

<b>Table 2-D: White Collar Crimes</b>	
<b>CRIME</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Forgery and Counterfeiting</b>	Forgery and Counterfeiting involve the altering, copying, or imitating of something, without authority or right, with the intent to deceive or defraud by passing the copy or thing altered or imitated as if it were original or genuine; or the selling, buying, or possession of an altered, copied, or imitated thing with the intent to deceive or defraud. Attempts are included.
<b>Fraud</b>	Fraud is the intentional perversion of the truth for the purpose of inducing another person or other entity in reliance upon it to part with something of value or to surrender a legal right. This offense includes the fraudulent conversion and obtaining of money or property by false pretenses. Confidence games and bad checks, except forgeries and counterfeiting, are included.
<b>Embezzlement</b>	Embezzlement is the unlawful misappropriation or misapplication by an offender to his/her own use or purpose of money, property, or some other thing of value entrusted to his/her care, custody, or control.

<b>Table 2-E: All Other Crimes</b>	
<b>CRIME</b>	<b>DEFINITION</b>
<b>Weapons Offenses</b>	Weapons offenses include the violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons. Attempts are included.
<b>Stolen Property</b>	Stolen Property Offenses include the buying, receiving, possessing, selling, concealing, or transporting of any property with the knowledge that it has been unlawfully taken, as by Burglary, Embezzlement, Fraud, Larceny, Robbery, etc. Attempts are included.
<b>All Other Offenses</b>	All Other Offenses include any violations of state or local laws not otherwise specifically identified (and not a Part 1 Offense or Part 2 Offense), except traffic violations.
